Dr. Ulven moved to accept the changes to our college Bye-laws, which was seconded by Dr. Yadav. Faculty present at the meeting voted by a unanimous vote to accept the proposed changes. In accordance with an earlier suggestion by Dr. Steele, the date of the changes to the document will be noted.

### 8. Announcements by Dean and Associate Dean

Dean Mike informed us that the Order of the Engineer Induction ceremony which is slated for May 11<sup>th</sup>(11 am) would be followed by a graduation reception to be hosted by the college. He indicated that the college now has a 24-member advisory committee, who would hold their first meeting on May 04. The committee's aims are advising, advancing and advocacy. The feasibility studies of the new building would be released a week before its due date. In answer to a question by a member, the dean indicated that it will not be possible to hire a college grant writer this year but the matter will be revisited in the next fiscal year. Software for grants processing will debut in October 2018.

According to Dr. Bezbaruah the Grand Challenge program has 17 students and are in need of additional faculty mentors. Dr. Ulven drew our attention to a similar need at the ND Governor's School. Students can also be paired with existing faculty research.
