3. Announcements

Dean Kessler:

- Corona Virus: International travel has been suspended at NDSU until March 31st. This has resulted in the Study Abroad trip to Germany and then Ireland to be canceled. Several universities have canceled face-to-face classes. This includes Harvard, University of Washington, Ohio State. Just this afternoon, Iowa State announced that March 23rd through April 3rd, all in-person instruction has moved to being on-line. University of Minnesota just announced that starting March 18th until at least April 1st, all five UM classes will be delivered on-line (again, no in-person classes).
- No announcements have been made for NDSU, but it is very likely. Likewise, we need to start preparing to switch our classes to being on-line delivery.
- Dean Kessler will start putting together a list of resources faculty could use for putting courses on-line. This includes
 - Zoom: A simple video-conferencing tool. The cost for zoom is \$75, which will be covered by the college. This will let you cover office hours, meetings, record lectures, etc. If you would like to use Zoom, please send an email to Melissa Kuntz saving you would like to use Zoom.
 - Blackboard Collaborate: This also lets you record lectures. There might be problems with Blackboard's servers being overloaded with all of the universities going on-line.

- *Please* be understanding and flexible when a student is sick. We don't want to force a student who is sick to feel they have not choice but to attend class or take a test.
- Lab Classes: We don't have a perfect answer as to what to do with lab classes if / when NDSU cancels in-person classes. One option is to have the TA run the lab, video tape the lab, and give the students the data for them to analyze. It's not perfect but that would be better than nothing.
- At this point, we don't know what we are going to do (stay open, cancel classes, close entirely).
- Homework: You can submit homework on Blackboard. Dr. Pieri has had good results from students turning in their homework on Blackboard. He suggests
 - Have the students take a photo of their homework,
 - Insert these photos into a word document, then
 - Submit the word document on Blackboard.
- Faculty searches are still on-going.

Kyle Bosch:

- How to Speak with Humans is an upcoming communications workshop for academics. Paul Sutter is an astrophysicists and will be talking about how to talk to lay-people. It's free and offered by RCA. The next College Happenings will have the registration link. The date is April 22 from 1:30 to 3:30pm
- NDSU Explore is coming up on April 22nd. This is the undergraduate research showcase. Registration is due by April 3rd. More details are available if you search "NDSU Explore"
- Research Connections is coming up on March 26th. This provides information on NSF Smart Connection Program.
- Grant Awards:
 - Kalpana and Dinesh R Katti. \$200,000 from the ND Department of Commerce for next generation solutions for bone regeneration.
 - Marjura Selekwa \$142,142 from the DOD for Phase II development of a robotic vehicle for testing PPG coatings.
 - Benjamin Braaten, Ewumbua Monono, Xin (Rex) Sun \$138,714 from John Deere for Phase 3 of the development of an RF sensing platform for grain detection.

Steve Jeffery:

- There are a couple of grants coming due by the end of March from NDSU Library. These are in the few thousand dollar range.
- The student organization is pushing for open educational resources (i.e. free on-line resources). There are several grants available at the end of March coming due. These are for adopting on-line resources and for alternate resources. Grants are for a few hundred dollars.
