3. Announcements

(Bosch): The following grant awards were received in CoE this last month and are reported in College Happenings:

- Dali Sun: \$652,149 from the National Institute of Health for research on noninvasive cancer detection.
- Di Wu: \$191,781 from the National Science Foundation for an EPSCoR Track 4 Fellows grant for training at the National Renewal Energy Laboratory.
- Chad Ulven and Ali Amiri: \$54,000 from the National Science Foundation for Natural Fiber Filled Thermo Plastics.

(Kessler): The merger of Civil and Environmental Engineering and Construction and Management Engineering is expected to take place July 1, 2021. The new name of the merged department will be Department of Civil Construction and Environmental Engineering (CCEE). There will still be two separate advisory boards, but the rest of the committees (including PT&E) will be combined. Meetings with faculty and advisory boards for the two departments have already taken place. Meetings with students in the two programs will happen shortly.

Next week is Engineer's Week: the 70th anniversary of E-Week. The goal is to call attention to the contributions of engineers. Its goals have expanded to reach out to young students to engage, educate, and inspire. This year's theme is "Imagining Tomorrow." Some of the activities include Sandy's Doughnuts next week on Monday (February 22nd) along with other activities.

Last week, President Bresciani sent out an email regarding the prioritization of process. They're currently collecting data on our academic and other programs. Their final report should be ready some time in April or May. Hopefully, they will have some good recommendations for how to avoid continual across the board cuts.

Several ongoing searches across CoE are ongoing, and we hope to have these filled before the end of the semester.

(Lima): The Technology and Instructional Services (T&IS) Committee is meeting with Marc Wallman some time in the next two weeks. Any faculty with questions or concerns about technology or instructional services on campus are encouraged to contact Dr. Lima.

The split is proposed so that any future changes in the CoE Bylaws can be made without having to go through the Provost for approval. It also brings CoE's Bylaws and PT&E Document into alignment with other colleges who also have split these into two stand-alone documents.
